About PRI

- Plastic Recycling Industries (PRI) is located in Nakawa division, Kampala City Council, 5km away from the city centre.
- The company was inaugurated in December 2006 as an **Initiative** Rwenzori Bottling Company Limited and is dedicated to the recycling of plastic waste.
- PRI became part of Coca-Cola Beverages Africa (CCBA) on 1st July, 2016.
- It is the largest plastic recycling industry in Uganda.
- PRI collects 8-10 tonnes daily of used plastics from the Environment
- Up to 120 suppliers deliver plastics in a month.
- Suppliers employ an average 10 people at their stores, creating opportunity to over 1200 Ugandans.
- PRI employs 45 permanent and 70-100 casuals depending on level of activity.



PRI role in uplifting communities

Ugandans below the poverty line: 19.7%
Over 80% of the beneficiaries are women



45 permanent employees



70-100 temporary staff daily



120 suppliers monthly



Over 1500 Collectors



Earnings: \$17 weekly

(soft drink containers)

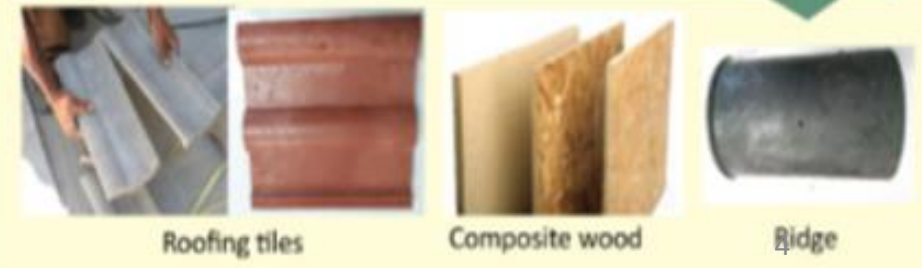


LDPE -low density polythene

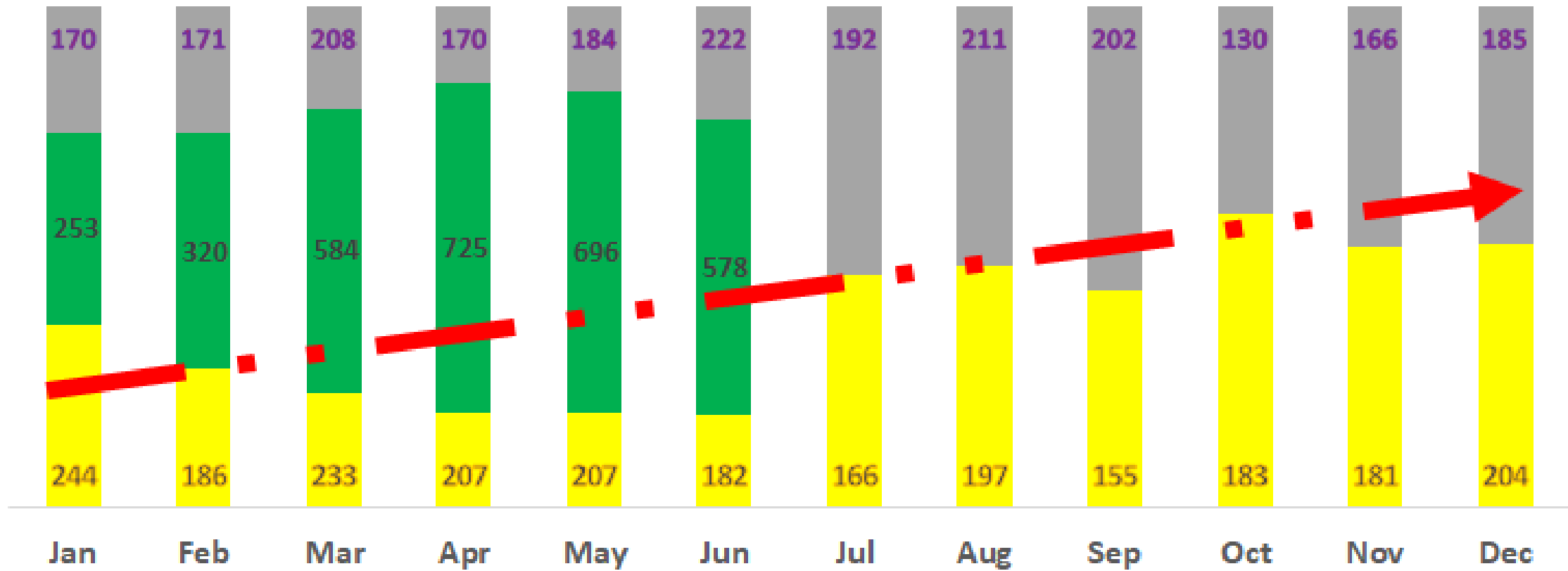
Local Products from Recycled Plastic

COLLECTION (TONS)

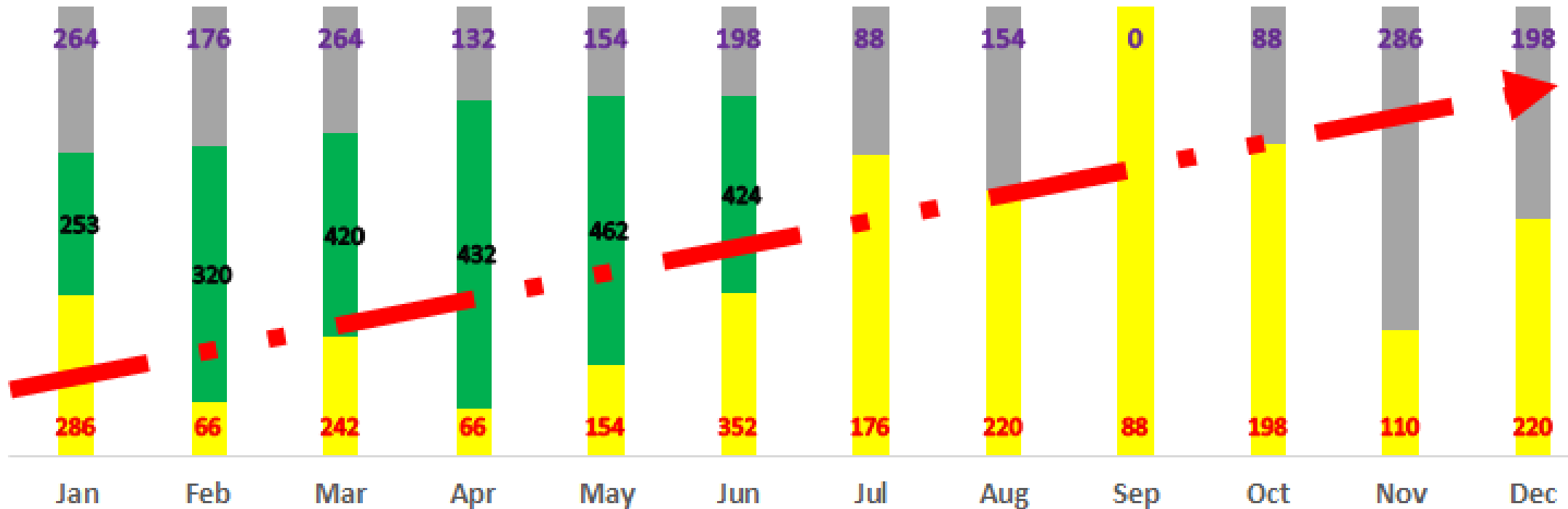

RECYCLED (TONS)

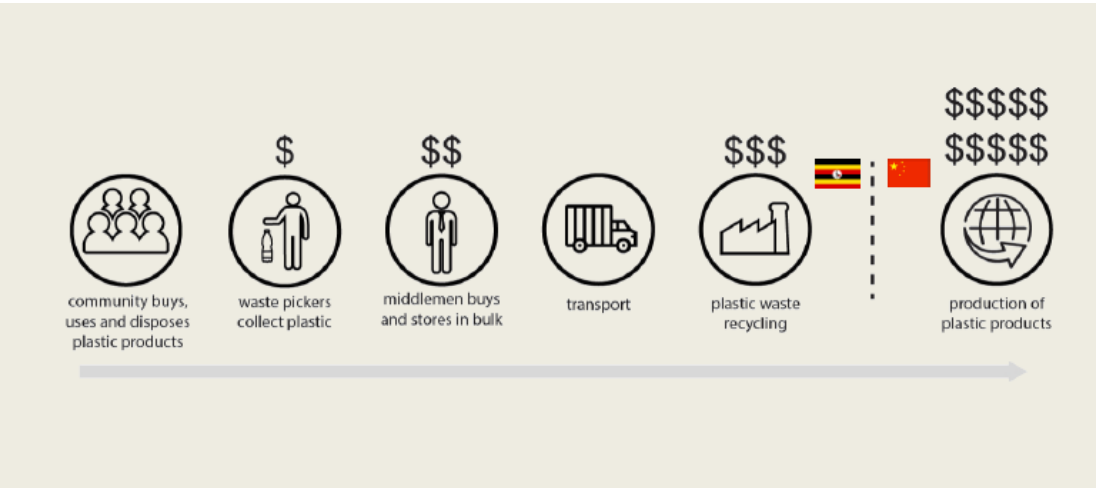
2018 2019 2017
